





Marston Parish Council

Due to other commitments we have had to move the date of our next meeting to Thursday the 6th February 2020. The meeting will take place at 7.30pm in the Chapel.

Over the Christmas period maintenance work has begun on the common land in order to clear the water courses. Charlie Howard has kindly spent a considerable amount of time clearing the Grip and the pond, alongside the work of clearing the New Farm ditches and relaying hedges, which run adjacent to the common land. We would like to take this opportunity to thank him for his work on behalf of the village.

The work replacing hardcore on the Horse path has been postponed until the weather improves. The path between Plough Lane and Close Lane, ROW 11, has now been cleared and we would like to thank the Dudman Family for doing this work.

The signs for the first phase of the footpath project have been ordered and will be erected in late February and early March, while tree felling and maintenance work will be undertaken by Conservation Contractors on behalf of the Parish before Spring.

At the next meeting we will be starting to formulate a plan to graze livestock on the common Land, below the Grip. The rationale behind this idea is threefold; the land will be used as was intended, maintenance costs will be greatly reduced and our environmental footprint will be improved. Input from parishioners will be appreciated on this, so please come along.

A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

I don't need to tell you that, at this time of year, the weather is at its coldest and bleakest. Traditionally, this is when food stores were running out and our forebears faced the privations of Lent for 40 days until Easter heralded the joys of spring. Indeed, there were good reasons why bleak February was a time to just cuddle up and stay in bed. It may be no coincidence that Valentine's Day is on the 14th February.

In these modern times, however, cold weather is not the main subject of interest. Whatever the frost and snow may bring, we are really worried about global warming. Climate change is now so evident that, even in benign, temperate Wiltshire, the Council has declared a Climate Emergency.

To deal with this challenge, the Council has established a Global Warming and Climate Emergency task group to consider Renewable energy generation, Energy use and efficiency, Planning, Transport and air quality, Waste, Land use, Business and industry, the Carbon baseline and the Renewable Energy baseline.

The Council is now making an investment of £5.2m on energy efficiency and energy generation on the Council's buildings etc. It is also investing £3.5m for solar panels and £12m to convert street lights to LED lighting. Already, waste to landfill has reduced from 56% in 2008-09 to 16% in 2018-19 and greenhouse gas emissions from the Council's operations have reduced from 26k tCO $_2$ e in 2014-15 to 16k tCO $_2$ e in 2018-19. Indeed, Friends of the Earth found Wiltshire Council to be the best performing local authority in England and Wales. Really!

The aim now is to ensure that Wiltshire is carbon-neutral by 2030. That's not long! You can do your bit to help by taking the **Green Pledge**. Suggestions are:

- Leave the car at home and walk more
- Take shorter showers and turn off taps when brushing teeth

Pastoral Letter


Thou art dust!

We all share at times a fragile life and we become vulnerable. A temporality of life suddenly overwhelms us. Being reminded on Ash Wednesday, the committed Christians are ready to face any suddenness or realities of pain and suffering along with the joy and peace that come to everyone's life. The priest says by putting ashes on a forehead "Remember thou art dust, and unto dust thou shalt return." (Gen. 3:19) on Ash Wednesday.

This statement reminds us of a few things. First, it reminds us of death and the vulnerable life that we have. This does not create fear or guilt in us. Rather this prepares us to face it and work through it with faith and courage. We Christians see the cross not as the symbol of a cruel death rather a victory over death. Though death is real, and pain and suffering are part of our lives, there is not only hope but the assurances of life through death as Jesus had defeated death through the cross and resurrection. It is not that we look forward to death, rather with faith we become stronger in facing death and realities of life here and now along with the promise of the life in God after death. This reminds us that we have a beautiful life to live; celebrate and be joyful. I can live life in the abundance that Christ has promised to each one of us. This teaches us that there is a dignity to each one of our lives; some disciplines can enhance the joy of this life and some duties may extend our lives. This may be one of the reasons that we celebrate the forty days of Lent in the church. Using ashes we ask people for self-discipline (at times some people do not drink alcohol or they try to give up smoking), some take up special duties (such as fasting or praying or meditating or reading the Bible) and some look at reflecting on themselves in order to recognise, appreciate and talk about their dignity and that of others. Therefore, Ashes on our forehead on Ash Wednesday remind us that in spite of our vulnerability and temporal life, we can enjoy the best part of our life together with God. Jesus uses the parable of the rich fool in order to highlight this by saying, God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life

First of all, a happy New Year to all. I haven't been doing too much in the garden since Christmas and New Year except for digging vegetables as needed. I did plant a couple of rows of broad beans just before the holiday, which was a bit later than I intended. The seeds were some I saved from last year's excellent crop, but I have high hopes for them! I shall finish spreading my load of farmyard manure around all our roses by the end of this weekend so hopefully they will respond with some lovely flowers all through the coming summer. I must also say that our newly refurbished pond is now full to the brim thanks to the excellent work done by my daughter and her fiancé, and plenty of rain. It has never filled right up before and it looks much better now. By spreading the manure copiously around the roses, I am hoping to improve moisture retention. Our sandy soil is really easy to work with but dries out very quickly whenever we have hot sunny weather. Jane and I are reluctant to use the hosepipe too often so by putting plenty of manure and compost around our flowers we save on watering. Over the last few years we do seem to have had some spells of really hot sunshine, which is often accompanied by a constant strong breeze which seems to dry our soil very quickly. Jane and I will be opening our garden for this year's 'Open Garden' weekend, so we want it looking tip top. Therefore I am hoping for kind, seasonal weather. Early spring drought is not what we need, but we shall enjoy the challenge of managing our garden to cope with whatever weather comes our way.

This will be an OPEN MEETING so do spread the word – all welcome.



Worton Parish Council

As we move into a new decade, your Parish Council is keeping itself busy looking at ways we can make the most of opportunities that come our way whilst maintaining the supportive community we enjoy living in. This was particularly the case over the holiday period where the seasonal singing at the Rose and Crown on Christmas eve (whilst perhaps not quite as tuneful as that at the church that had preceded it) was certainly "harmonious" in the true sense and further evidence of just how important both are to the village - and here I must give thanks to Jackie, John, the Reverend Ali and the myriad helpers who make these things happen for us to enjoy.

Linked to this, we have agreed to set up a Village Maintenance group. Whilst under the auspices of the Parish council, this should provide a simple mechanism by which we can try to make sure that any of a range of activities that might take place would be covered by council insurance, thus protecting the, hopefully, large numbers who would be involved in any project; Sandleaze Bank being one example.

You may be aware of speculation surrounding a small area of land near the entrance to Mill Head and I feel it would be sensible to establish the true picture before any rumours get out of hand.

In summary: Wiltshire Council have enquired as to whether your Parish Council would be interested in purchasing several small pieces of land within the village boundary at a nominal fee. We feel that this particular plot of land has much more potential to be of use than the other areas, due to its size and location. The others seem impractical and would be costly to maintain with no obvious benefit to the community.

The plot in Mill Head does, however, offer the potential to be of more use so we have been discussing what this could be and what the implications would be.

One possibility is that it could provide much needed extra car parking for the village hall and the church. Whilst this is not a new issue, it has recently come to the fore with problems created currently by cars parked on the main road using the village hall (see below).

It is important to understand that no decisions have been made with regard to this, though we have done some basic investigations into



possible costs in order to ascertain whether any development of this nature would be viable. We are at a very early stage and would ensure that the community would be fully consulted before any commitment would be made. Indeed, there are other possible uses for that particular plot of land. We intend to provide more information on this in due course, probably at the annual village meeting which is likely to be in May.

The specific problem with regard to car parking has been the use of the road immediately in front of the village hall bus stop. We have discussed this with the local Wiltshire Council CATG group (which provides support and funding with regard to issues like this) and expect improved clarification to control parking by road markings. Whilst we await this change we are hoping to put some informative signage in place to deter those who currently park there. We have also been considering whether we can have road markings in place to deter parking in other locations in the village, at the entrance to Cedar Close for example.

Finally, a word of warning and a reminder to take care when using the footpaths around the village. Whilst we believe most to be usable, particular care is needed at this time of the year and we would not want anyone taking an early dip in Mill Race, for example!



Letter sent to Marston Parish Council, Richard Gamble and The Bridge

Sir,

Eighteen months ago, I walked Long St, Marston with three members of the Parish Council to identify which areas of the common could be conserved for wildlife and which could be cut.

It was agreed that the right hand side hedges and thickets should be left as they are; the dew pond near the equestrian centre should be retained and the area towards the chicken farm entrance on the left hand side where flag irises flowered (up to 3 years ago) should also be spared cutting.

In the last three weeks contractors have completely destroyed the hedges on the right, the dew pond has had a ditch put across it and the flag iris area has had silt from a ditch spread on top.

I have three questions for you:

Firstly, did the Parish Council give permission for this work? If it did, it has presided over the destruction of habitat for many mammals, the destruction of forage for thousands of pollinating insects and the destruction of nesting sites for our declining bird populations.

Secondly, if the Parish Council did not give permission, will action be taken against the contractors for the damage caused on common land?


Thirdly, will you make sure that the dew pond and flag iris area are returned to their natural state?

Our flora and fauna are already in serious decline and actions like this add to the problem.



Community Led Housing

Community Led Housing is a way for local communities to provide their own decent and affordable homes. Typically, community led housing schemes are:

- Homes built and owned by the community for the long-term benefit of the community
- Run by a local, independent and not for profit organisation, often specially created for this purpose
- Building homes for sale or rent but, whatever the mix, it is about keeping them affordable now and in the future
- Ensuring key decisions on new homes are made by the community, from the most suitable site, through design, to who moves in.
- Democratic and accountable to the wider community

To be successful Community Led Housing needs to have meaningful community engagement and widespread community support. There needs to be a common vision, shared values and a group of volunteers to deliver the vision.

Worton Parish Council will be hosting an event in the Village Hall in early spring to provide more details about Community Led Housing and to discuss possible sites. The council is keen to see whether this initiative would get widespread community support and that sufficient volunteers are willing to make it happen.
