Maureen's Ramblings April '24

Every year the church walks the walk with Jesus from Good Friday to Easter Day – remembering the love story and seeking fresh inspiration for our faith. On Easter Eve we light a fire in the darkness to celebrate the first light of Easter and that Jesus is the "light of Christ" coming into the world. From the fire we light our own candles and bring them into the darkened church which gradually became awash with light. Beautiful symbolism!

Some years ago, as I looked at the candlelight, I had a sudden realisation – what does "Resurrection" really mean? Do I really understand what I am celebrating here? My faith tells me it means that Jesus is with us always and that death is not the end of the story - but here I was being given an invitation to explore afresh this central mystery of our faith.

Since then, I have never taken the Resurrection for granted. Each Easter I look at the candles casting their light into the darkness and feel that I am caught-up in an eternal love story which is beyond all telling. Do I understand the Resurrection any better now? Of course I don't! The depth of love involved in what Jesus did for us is something I will never be able to understand. Jesus' parables of the man searching for the pearl of great price and the woman searching for her lost coin challenge me continue to search for the meaning of Christ's Resurrection, especially in the midst of all the confusion, doubt, conflict and brokenness that is within me and the world.

The disciples didn't understand the Resurrection either! On Easter morning they had only an empty tomb, a missing body and rumours of Jesus being seen alive again. Mary Magdalene thought the man she met was a gardener - discovering, when he spoke her name - "Mary", that it was Jesus himself. I would love to have been with those disciples - listening to their conversations as they moved from despair to the bare beginnings of hope, then to their own encounters with Jesus, and finally to the realisation that he had indeed 'risen from the dead' and was truly with them now and always.

Do I understand what Resurrection means? No - but I don't have to understand what it means, and I don't have to explain it or convince anyone that it happened. It is enough for me to believe that God came among us simply because he loves us. He spent his life healing, forgiving, and showing, by everything he did and said, that we are loved with a love which is infinite and eternal. It is enough to believe



that the Resurrection shows that love does triumph over evil; that light does expel darkness and that there is a joy and hope which is deeper than pain, betrayal, trauma or death and which is ocean deep and always ready to rise again.

At their March meeting, Worton Parish Council approved the formation of a Village Maintenance Working Group aka 'The Wellies'.

The purpose of the working group is to organise working parties to undertake maintenance of:

- Sandleaze Open Space
- · Sandleaze Playing Field and Play Equipment
- · Sandleaze Bank and 'King Charles Copse'

The working group will also consider and undertake projects which will be of benefit to the parish and increase the use of the parish footpaths and recreational spaces. It will also work with other village groups and organisations for the benefit of the above.

Another duty of the working group will be the regular inspection and safety checks of the Sandleaze play equipment.







Home Upgrade Grant Scheme (HUGS) - do you qualify?

Wiltshire Council has been successful in securing more than £3.6m government funding for home energy efficiency upgrades. This funding will allow the council to support retrofitting in owner-occupied and privately rented homes (landlords with no more than four properties).

The qualifying criteria are:

- not connected to mains gas
- have an energy performance certificate (EPC) rating of band D-G
- household income of less than £31,000

The retrofits will include:

- energy efficiency measures such as wall and loft insulation
- low-carbon heating technologies such as heat pumps
- renewable technologies such as solar PV
- smart measures such as smart heating controls

It would be great if qualifying residents in Worton and Marston could take advantage of this brilliant opportunity for warmer and more energy efficient homes.

MESSAGE FROM OUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR

April 2024

Parish Councils and residents across Devizes Rural West tell me that improving our roads and transport must be an absolute priority for Wiltshire Council. I'm pleased to report that additional emphasis is being placed on these important issues with a reorganisation of Wiltshire Council Cabinet responsibilities. I have been appointed Cabinet Member for Transport and Assets, and I will work alongside Cllr Nick Holder, who has taken on responsibility for Highways, Street Scene, and Flooding.

The council has allocated an extra £10m over the next two years to spend on filling potholes and a road resurfacing programme that will help to prevent potholes and other highways defects across all areas of the county. The investment will also fund more small, local repairs to verges on rural roads. This funding is in addition to the £20.7m the council receives from the Government's Highways Maintenance fund for 2024/25, plus the £5.2m from the Department for Transport's recently announced Road Resurfacing Fund following the cancellation of HS2 (northern section). The council also allocated an extra £1m in its recent budget for emptying gullies around the county to prevent flooding and enable teams to focus on problem areas that are most at risk - on top of the £1.27m the council already spends on gully emptying.

In my extended Cabinet role, I am responsible for all transport across the County including Rail, Buses, and Active Travel (walking, cycling, and wheeling). I will lead the Council's work on its Local Transport Plan 4 (to 2038) which will set out the council's objectives, plans, and indicators for transport in Wiltshire and provide a framework for all other organisations with a direct or in-direct involvement in transport in Wiltshire. I have supported the development of the brilliant Wiltshire Connect "demand responsive" bus service which now connects Devizes, Pewsey, Marlborough, and Hungerford. Over the coming months I am very much looking forward to ensuring that we have more travel choices which connect our communities, enabling people to get to work, and school, and provide transport connections for people visiting the area.

Meanwhile, of course, I will work with Cllr Nick Holder and the Highways Team to secure improvements to our local roads and to accident black spots such as Black Dog and Bell Crossroads. As always, please use the MyWilts app to report highways and flooding "maintenance" issues. Whilst requests for "improvements" should be raised with Parish Councils so that these can be taken to the Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group. (LHFIG).



WORTON PARISH COUNCIL

I owe thanks to Richard Slack for ably chairing the March meeting whilst I fulfilled a long-held ambition to visit New Zealand.

New Housing Development

I was able to keep an occasional eye on things happening on the other side of the world and have returned to find that work has finally begun on the new housing estate. This is an important step towards the end of a period of uncertainty in the history of our village that has been a challenge for so many of us in different ways.

Now we can have more assurance on what this will mean for us socially, environmentally, and economically. We will attempt to provide a lead on this enabling concerns, suggestions etc. to be communicated and plans made to move forward together. The Parish Council is engaging with Newlands on a regular basis and will update as often as we can using social media as well as more traditional methods which will, of course, tend to be slower! We have a contact established with them and will liaise with them to smooth things if needed during the construction process. It will be important to establish that the Parish Council's role should be limited to general concerns and that direct communication by residents with the developers may often be more appropriate and effective.

The next few months are likely to be interesting!

Village Hall

We continue to liaise with the Village Hall trustees in relation to their kitchen refurbishment plans and are very ready to support appropriately. As a side note, I think it's important to stress that the positioning of one of the Walkway plaques by the Village Hall is no longer being proposed by the Parish Council, though the application from the newly established committee for Community Fund support was agreed. This should enable progress to be made soon.

Transport and Road Safety

As far as Highways issues are concerned, we have agreed to take two proposals forward with LHFIG, specifically a reduction of speed limit on the eastern village approach to the village and a new crossing point (similar to that by Cedar Close). Both of these can be viewed as linked to concerns leading on from the new housing development, from where we would hope to have useful support.

Mill Leet

Unfortunately, concerns about Mill Leet and Semington Brook continue and are causing considerable stress for some of our residents. Tamara Reay has confirmed her intention to work with interested parties, including Worton Parish Council, to come to a satisfactory resolution as soon as practicable. We are always willing to listen and will do what we can to support in a highly complex situation.

Annual Village Meeting

We have set a date for our annual village meeting, which will take place at the Rose and Crown on April 30th (thanks John and Jackie) at 7pm. We are hoping to arrange for a Newlands Home representative to be able to attend as well as a sharing of our ideas for the name of the new estate. We will be able to share updates on what new finance will be available linked to the development and listen to ideas about how it could be best used. There will also be a chance to learn about how the new "Wellies" environment group led by Cllr Powell will work in practice.

It would be great to see lots of you there.

FLOWER OF THE MONTH



Sweet Pea (Lathyrus odoratus)

The sweet delicate scent of sweet peas may never have graced our gardens if they hadn't been sent to England in the late 1600's by Francis Cupani, a Sicilian monk. From there, they may have languished in the laboratory of Dr. Robert Uvedale, a teacher and plant enthusiast, if not for Henry Eckford. His passion and expertise transformed the humble, yet fragrant and flowery, plant from minor garden subject to the 'Queen of Annuals'.

Sweet peas prefer sun and well-drained, rich, organic soil, so not really great for anyone living in Marston. Perhaps our Worton gardners have better luck. Of course, raised gardens filled with rich soil might be a better option. They grow beautifully up trellis, arches, or fences and can make a lovely, scented transition between sections of your garden.

In France, bouquets of sweet peas are still given to brides providing good luck on their wedding day. And in olden days, sweet peas were often worn in pockets to provide fragrance to clothing. Perhaps, that is also why they are given to brides on their wedding days...to ensure they smell delightful to their newly betrothed.

Worton and Marston School News

The school was alive with activity throughout our Week of Opportunities. The aim was to give the children a structured play week based on the world of work. Every child at our school now knows about the process of applying for a job and attending for interview.

Before we started our week, the Advisor for English, Mr Alan Howe, spent a morning in the school working with the staff and the children on the process of being an interviewer and an interviewee. The juniors worked on the story of Red Riding Hood. They had to play the parts of the characters and be interviewed by their classmates.

The following week, on Monday the children were very busy filling in their application form for a job that was advertised in our school "Job Centre". They also had to write a letter of application to give more information. On the Tuesday, every child had an interview. These were conducted by the teachers, governors, parents and friends. The children took this role play very seriously and attended for the interview in suitable smart clothes. One child brought along examples of her work to support her application to be a designer. On Wednesday morning every child was appointed to a job. For the next three days they worked on their task. Each job had activities and tasks that were suitable for the children but also related to the adult job.

Thus the nurses learned how to save a life by putting a casualty into the recovery position. They also learned how to summon help without endangering their own life. Mrs Watts helped the keep fit trainers produce a keep fit video. The financial consultants visited Lloyds Bank in Devizes to find out about the world of finance. They conducted a survey to find the best bank or building society in which children should save their money. The gamekeepers visited Mr Frank Chandler to learn how to trap vermin that prey upon pheasants. They had to design and make their own magpie trap. The health visitors found out about caring for babies. They did some research into which is the best nappy for a baby to wear. The orthoptists found out about testing children's eyes. They designed their own tests for eyesight and colour blindness as well as making some prototype spectacles. Mr Dave Churchill helped the fire fighters find out how to protect their home and school from fire. They conducted a survey to see how many families have a smoke alarm as this simple device can save many lives. The security officers used the work they have been doing in school this term to help them make a burglar alarm. The commercial producers had to make an advertisement for our school that was exactly 30 seconds long. They went to Mr Dawson's recording studio to make their tape. The nutritionalists cooked some healthy food for everyone to sample. The designers had to design and make an egg cup for an Easter Egg. Mr Terry worked with the trading standards officers to test our school weights and make a range of accurate measures that the children can use for cooking. The landscape architects conducted a survey to see how the children would like to improve our school grounds.
