

There are always plenty of volunteers for community events. Children laugh and play at the village fete. The churches call Horses and dogs (with their people) pass along the lanes. Donkeys bray and chickens cluck while the sheep baa in the fields.

I honestly couldn't think of a more idyllic place to call home. The sense of community is heartwarming and reminds me of what it means to be a good neighbor and feel connected.

An 'Other' Place June '24

I've been lucky enough to do a bit of travelling recently, some of it related to my academic work, some of it for leisure. One striking things is how airports, only ever variations on a theme at any time, have become nearly the same all over the world. Not only do they contain the same signs and follow the same rules, with the shops and the same brands, but often a highly mobile workforce that crosses continents regularly.

The 21st Century has had a tendency to flatten everything. All over the world, even in places with very different political systems or religious allegiances. People wear the same clothes and listen to the same music. From buses in Armenia to trains in Zambia, I have witnessed people glued to the same smartphones are dominated by the same apps – the red and white of YouTube, blue and white of Facebook, orange and purple of Instagram. I see the same on the number 49 from Devizes to Trowbridge.

It can feel like everywhere has become like anywhere, yet we know that some places simply feel different, in some undefinable and timeless way. I often sense that at Avebury, especially in the quieter sites away from the village centre. Stonehenge can have this sense too, at least if one can manage to visit when the crowds aren't around. Perhaps this is because of what happened there in the past, what intense emotions were felt there; from what little we genuinely know about those who built them, these were sites of intense devotion.

The great Christian places of pilgrimage often have that same, ineffable, sense of being somehow other. My most profound experience of this was at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. At first, I found it an irritating place. I had hoped that getting there at 5.30 pm would dodge the crowds—but no such luck! Then out of the blue, something made the hair stand on the back of my neck, and I was moved almost to tears.



We don't need to go as far as the Holy Land to find Christian holy places that overwhelm us with their sense of sanctity. Wells is somewhere that can, in the right light, feel like another world; its Cathedral is a place of great antiquity and holiness. It is a place where people often find rest from what troubles them and healing from what wounds them.

The hall was packed to the gills, and I experienced one of the things I envisaged when we moved back to the UK; thriving village communities, which can come together and have fun. It seems to be quite unique these days and something to enjoy and protect.

At the end everyone, unexpectedly, pitched in to clear up leaving the Trustees with little to do!

GENERAL IMPROVEMENT PLANS

We will, over the course of the next few months, start to improve some of the outside look of the building, including things like repainting the railings. At this point, I'd like to thank Alison Parker from the Gardening Club for replanting the wooden tubs on the front, they look great. Also, the grass cutting rota has kicked in again and it looks very trim!

In order to provide a better entertainment space, we are looking at installing a drop-down screen and ceiling projector. This will be much better for group presentations and potentially some film nights - watch this space!

Having attended some Village Hall networking events, we are probably the only hall that doesn't have internet and WiFi service. At this time the funding for this is in question, but we will look into the options for low cost or sponsored internet service.

KITCHEN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The project had stalled for a couple of months while we got the scaled down plans drawn up and re-tendered for the new work. As of this report, we are expecting to review the new tender responses on the 27th and hopefully we can then make some better progress.



The Mathieson Music Trust

WHO members, Soprano Barbara Gompels, Mezzo Soprano Paula Boyagis, Tenor Carlos Alonso together with pianist Tony James join forces with international



cellist **Anup Biswas** for a special musical concert to raise money for the Mathieson Trust in Kolkata India which celebrates its 30th Anniversary.

The evening will take place on 15th June at Market Lavington Community Hall starting at 6pm with a home cooked Indian meal followed by a range of musical delights from opera to songs from the shows.

The Mathieson Music Trust – The Mathieson Mission School was established in 1994, by Maestro Anup Kumar Biswas, it is a registered charity and was set up in memory of his guru, Father Theodore Mathieson, an Anglican priest from England. Father Mathieson of the Oxford Mission dedicated his entire life to the poor children of Bengal. After Mathieson's death in 1994, Mr Biswas became his torchbearer, aiming to emulate his work and morals by helping children from the poorest families. Mr Biswas wanted to give the opportunities he received through Father Mathieson's generosity, to other children coming from impoverished backgrounds like his own. For 30 years, Mr. Biswas has singlehandedly fundraised globally for the trust through concerts, classes, workshops, and other such events. Some key performances were in the presence of the late Queen Elizabeth II of England and King Charles III; the venues Mr Biswas has performed in range from the Royal Albert Hall (UK), The Carnegie Hall (USA), Commonwealth Institute (UK) and the Bayreuth Opera House (Germany) to name a few. The funds raised from these events have paid for the construction of the school buildings and their maintenance, resources, and teaching of the children.

Is that my misfortune or just the way things be? Should I be sad and lonely? But I'm not, I'm glad,



WORTON AND MARSTON VILLAGE SHOW

We trust you all have the date for this years show, our golden anniversary, in your diaries but just in case, it will be held on **Saturday 31st August** in the Village Hall.

It's been a difficult year for getting seeds to germinate and grow, too cold and wet, but as the temperature is improving so plants are starting to grow. For the vegetables and fruit classes, most things will need to be in the ground by the time the magazine comes out. One thing that you can plant now is gladiolus. They reckon it takes about 100 days from sowing to flowering. We think that gladiolus are one of the stars of the exhibition benches. If you have not planted seeds, I am sure there will be lots of places selling young plants you can grow on. To enter most classes you only need a few veg or flowers so for those without big gardens, you can grow things in all sorts of containers on the patio, etc.

We thought we would point you to a few of the new classes in the show and some of the less popular ones. Climbing French beans is new this year. I think they are easier than the dwarf variety and if kept fed and watered, will produce a lot of produce. For those who keep chickens, we have added a class of four hen eggs in the home produce section. And we have added a second flower arrangement, this one is 'open' so there is no restriction on size, composition, including frames or other materials.

And what about having a go at the planted pot. The pot can be up to 18 inches in diameter and can include up to 6 varieties of plants. Of the 6 varieties there are no restrictions on the number of plants so you can be quite artistic.

For the show this year we hope to have a marquee so the space for exhibiting entries will be increased. So as always the more entries the merrier we will be.

MESSAGE FROM OUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR

Continued Focus on Highways – June 2024

I hear from Residents and Parish Councils that Highways and Transport are the top issues locally and I am continuing to make the case at Wiltshire Council for more funding and for more schemes to take forward. As well as the funding settlement the Council receives from the Department for Transport (more details are in the graphic below) Wiltshire Council is making additional investment from its own budget including £1m (over 3 years) for gully cleaning to prevent flooding, £600,000 (over 3 years) for painting white lines and £500,000 for litter removal.



As always, please report any maintenance issues on the My Wilts app so that they can be addressed by Highways Engineers. You may also wish to sign up for Wiltshire Council email newsletters where you can select the topics you are interested in hearing about.

I'm pleased that there has been progress at Black Dog - Wiltshire Council is trialling an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) on the little spur road from the Worton Road, as there is evidence that some motorists use this spur road as a short cut to then turn south on the A360 and this has contributed to the issues at the crossroads. This trial scheme will look at whether closing this road reduces collisions and if there is an impact on the surrounding network. The trial scheme will include an exemption for access into the adjacent fields, but through movement by motor vehicles will not be permitted.

A barrier will be installed at the junction of the A360 and C20 spur road and signage will warn drivers of no through access. This trial is the first stage of improvements to the crossroads; whilst negotiations continue to secure the land to enable the Council to realign the junction at the crossroads.

I am continuing to make the case for improvements at Bell Crossroads and I am supporting Seend Parish Council with an application to reduce the speed on the A361 through The Stocks. I am also supporting Worton Parish Council with the application to the Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group for more traffic calming and pedestrian measures in Worton High Street and Potterne Parish Council with an application for a 20mph limit in Whistley Road.

Since I was elected, I have championed cycling and walking opportunities too – and I have led the development of a Local Walking and Cycling Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP), which is a prioritised plan for improvements and enables funding to be secured for new walking and cycling paths. Whilst these projects do take some time to work through the Highways & Transport system, I will do my very best, along with your Parish Councils to champion the initiatives which will help make our villages safer and even better places to live. Councillor Appointments

I'll begin by passing on the news that I had the honour of being unanimously appointed as Chair for the next year, with Richard Slack also unanimously supported as Vice Chair. Incidentally, you may have noticed that there were no council elections for us this time round. It's our turn next year when all the current Councillors stand down and then put their names forward again if they wish to stand for election. Often there are fewer applicants than positions available (currently nine) but if there were a larger number of applicants an election would take place.

New Housing Development

I'm not used to the dynamic world of journalism, but, for the first time, I can include a STOP PRESS announcement. Arguably, the most important decision we made at our May meeting was the selection of "Primrose View" as our submission for the naming of the new Housing development and I can confirm that Wiltshire Council have confirmed that this WILL be the name for the new development, which is wonderful news. I understand that Keith was able to give his full support to the idea and that it gave him considerable pleasure to know that Prim had been so much at the heart of our village that we wanted her to be remembered in this way. Whilst, sadly, we seem to have lost far too many village stalwarts and "characters" recently, all of whom have left their mark, it feels appropriate to honour the Wrights in this way as they together made such a difference for so long.

We were pleased that there were other strong suggestions that were given due consideration. It was particularly interesting to learn of the historical significance of the name "Noah" and we have some ideas about how that might become associated with the development as well.

Traffic Flow

Still with the new housing development, as I write we have begun to experience the impact of the site access arrangements to traffic flow. Whilst some disruption is inevitable, specific safety concerns have been communicated which we have raised with the developers urgently when we became aware of them. As the work progresses, please contact Jules (clerk@worton.org.uk) if you have any concerns, who can point you in the right direction or follow up on your behalf as appropriate.

Affordable Housing Application

I have been in discussion with White Horse Housing who will be managing the allocation and management of the affordable housing that will be part of the new development. I have been assured that the village, in the form of the Parish Council, will be able to have a major role in allocation decisions in order to ensure that applicants who are directly linked to the village have priority. We will give you more information about the process at an appropriate time.

Transport / Road Safety

Cllr. Slack has been doing sterling work on our behalf, liaising with the LHFIG on transport /road safety issues. As I have explained before, this is an excellent way of getting financial support for improvements to our benefit but is something of a "long game" as money is limited and there is always a range of projects competing for the same limited pot. We have decided, following advice, that, at the present time, a reduction of the speed limit on the eastern approach to the village isn't viable for a combination of financial and practical issues. However, the provision of a new marked crossing place, combined with measures to slow traffic movement through the village, looks like a better plan and will be pursued at future meetings with a realistic hope of success. More detail as and when appropriate.

Best Kept Village

Those in attendance at the Annual Parish Meeting will be aware of our decision to enter the Best Kept Village competition next year. Malcolm's "Wellys" will form an important part of the on-going preparations and it would be good to see plenty of support on June 1st when the next session is scheduled. Whilst we were giving some thought to what the priorities should be, we considered our rather uninspiring bus stops (as raised at the Parish Meeting). There were some interesting ideas which we will look into further.

Jubilee Walkway

One on-going project that we have moved forward with is the positioning of one of the Worton Jubilee Walkway plaques. Cllr. Goodenough has put her heart and soul into this project and has been frustrated by just how difficult it has proved to position a plaque. I'm hoping that, by the time of publication, it will be in place and all will be happy with the location. We will then look to move forward with the production of a village trail based on the walkway in good time to be a part of the welcome to our new residents as the housing is completed.

Worton Charities

I'd also like to recommend that as many as possible drop in at the Worton Charities event on June 12th in the Village Hall which Bill Francis gave details of at the Annual Parish Meeting, concerning a possible housing development on some of the land that the Charity is responsible for. This would be a significant development for the village and it's important that as large a number as possible are aware of the details and able to form an opinion. Please also refer to the submission on page 46 that gives more details.



FLOWER OF THE MONTH



Honeysuckle (Lonicera periclymenum)

There are many variations on the beloved fragrant honeysuckle. It can grow as a shrub or vine and the flowers range from white, to yellow, to pastel pink, to vibrant pink, and reds. They are a member of the Caprifoliaceae family and are native to the Northern hemisphere with some species coming from China, Japan, Europe, India, and America. The most common species is the Lonicera perclymenum, named after the German botanist, Adam Lonicer.

The name 'honeysuckle' is derived from the Middle English word honeysouke, which translates to 'honey suck'. It is believed they were named from children's tendency to pick the blossom and suck out the sweet nectar from the flowers. They thrive in full sun and well-draining soil, so not great for our thick clay soil. They work well in pots trained up garden walls or trellis. The sweet fragrance of the flowers are an irresistible attraction to butterflies and bees.

Historically, honeysuckle has held a place in both ceremonial as well as medicinal circles. The Druids used symbols of honeysuckle in the Cetic alphabet to represent joy and happiness. While in China, honeysuckle is traditionally thought to promote positive emotions—probably due to their lovely scent.

Honeysuckle can often be found adorning the entryway of homes. It is believed this is to create a feeling of nostalgia and to honour those who have died. According to legends, planting honeysuckle near the home would keep away negativity and protect one from evil spirits.

Herbalists may use honeysuckle in their treatment of a number of ailments—digestive disorders, respiratory issues, and headaches. Additionally, it has been used to treat arthritis, rashes, skin disease and even snake bites.

- household income of less than £31,000

The retrofits will include:

- energy efficiency measures such as wall and loft insulation
- low-carbon heating technologies such as heat pumps
- renewable technologies such as solar PV
- smart measures such as smart heating controls
